Dear Sirs

The Exhaust Gas Cleaning Systems Association maintains a map on its website (<https://www.egcsa.com/map-regulations/>) with information for shipowners on local regulations relating to use of scrubbers and overboard

discharges from these systems. It is EGCSA policy to only publish official information e.g. from government or port authority websites rather than from unofficial sources, which may not be correct.

We have noted that a number of P&I clubs have published advice that closed loop scrubbers and hybrid scrubbers operating in closed loop mode are permitted in Gibraltar waters, but that open loop scrubbers are temporarily not allowed as a precautionary measure until the Gibraltar Government arrives at a definitive policy decision with regards their use.

We would publish this information on the EGCSA website but as we have been unable to find an official source are hoping you can provide port authority confirmation or direct us to a website with relevant details or a more appropriate contact.
